Above all, Michael was a family man. He shared 58 beautiful years with his beloved wife, Mary Ann, who stood by his side through every chapter. Together they raised five children-Lisa Phillips (Corey), Patrick Burke (Annie), Sherri Roenfeldt (Clint), Kathi Buchholz, and Traci Gemberling (Kurt)-whom he loved dearly and of whom he was immensely proud. His greatest joy came from being a husband, father, and grandfather, and his family was the heart of his life. He is the grandfather of 17 grandchildren and 4 great-grandchildren.

He was preceded in death by his father and mother, Dracos and Carrie Burke, brother Alan Burke, sister-in-law Linda Plough, granddaughter Harper Gemberling, and nephew William Burke.
